Making a Difference

With the help of CFPDP, endowment funds and awards for students with disabilities have so far been established at York University, Toronto Metropolitan University, the University of Manitoba, Pearson College, Ivey Business School at the University of Western Ontario, Queen's University, Osgoode Hall Law School at York University, Ontario Tech University and the University of Calgary. Multiple endowment funds have been created at some of these institutions. CFPDP recognizes the generosity of the Asper Foundation, Thorpe Family Foundation, Duncan and Michelle Sinclair Foundation, Feiga Bresver Academic Fund, Noor Cultural Centre, the Dottori-Attanasio Family and the Aaron Family, among others, in creating these legacies.

Other schools have allocated hundreds of thousands of dollars and are waiting for matching donors. CFPDP is speaking with additional universities and

possible donors, asking them to participate and help broaden the program across Canada.

"For those contemplating a donation, know that your contributions can create extraordinary change, supporting educational pathways that empower future leaders and a future where all individuals can thrive and achieve their full potential," says Dottori-Attanasio.

She adds, "What stands out [about A Seat at the Table and its associated endowment funds initiative] is how the program blends financial support with a

focus on leadership. This isn't just about providing funds; it's about nurturing future leaders in a way that encourages meaningful influence within corporate governance. The program's unique emphasis on creating a sustainable future — including a rich pipeline of qualified individuals for board positions, is what sets it apart from others."



CFPDP is inviting donors to give \$100,000 and will add \$10,000 to every fund that is established. Universities and colleges provide matching funds, creating a \$220,000 endowment fund to grant awards and bursaries in perpetuity using the investment proceeds.
